
II. DOWNLOAD MENDELEY DESKTOP

Mendeley Desktop is used to manage scientific articles that will be used as reference source, creating citation sources and bibliography.




Install Mendeley Web Importer must be done so that the process of downloading PDF files from the internet automatically goes to All documents on mendeley Desktop




Selecting browser for Mendeley Web Importer

Select Firefox browser-→scroll down-→ select download browser extension







Select Chrome browser-→ scroll down-→ select Install Chrome browser extension

Mendeley Web Importer automatically installed on Chrome bookmark




IX. DOWNLOAD FILE WITH MENDELEY WEB IMPORTER


Select the Journal Article from the Internet you prefer, then open the PDF



Select Import to Mendeley—sign in (if not logged into Mendeley's account)




A Tool Box will appear to download the PDF---select Save



To view downloaded articles from Mendeley Web Importer – select Sync (Synchronize) on Mendeley Desktop




Each time an activity is done (download, save, etc.), our laptop/ desktop must connected to the internet to allow synchronization of having updated works in the Mendeley Server




X. INPUT BIBLIOGRAPHY SOURCES OF NON-ONLINE REFERENCE (PRINTED BOOKS/ARTICLES, AV, ETC.)

Not all reference sources (articles/books) come from online sources, for printed sources, AV etc., we must fill in the bibliography by type in the Mendeley, for example books: Title/Author/Publisher/place of publication/year of publication, Scientific articles: Article title/author/Journal title/volume/number/year of publication.

XII. SEARCH FOR AN ARTICLE


Method I: Select Search: type in the title/subject/author

Method II: Select Filter: Publications/author




XIII. INSTALL MS WORD PLUG IN

Install Ms Word Plug In must be done in order to connect Mendeley Desktop with Ms. Word in the process of creating citation sources and bibliography.




Open Ms. Word, Select Reference, Insert Citation Mendeley, Insert Bibliography & Open Mendeley will appear




XIV. MAKING CITATION SOURCES

Point the cursor at the place where the citation source will be listed, it can be at the beginning or at the end of a sentence (depending on the bibliography style option selected)



Select Bibliography style – Insert citation – Mendeley tool box – type title/author/subject or select Go to Mendeley--



Select an article for citation sources – Select cite – citations sources will automatically appear in Ms. Word




